
# Setting a Vision and new philosophy to Shipping

## Turning our Vision into Action

Comprises of 35 Sustainable actions with a timeframe of implementation aiming, among others, to:

- ✓ Foster a Proactive Culture of Quality on Cyprus Flagged Ships
- ✓ Provide a Responsive, Fast, Efficient and Seamless 24/7 Customer-orientated Service
- Reward and Incentivize "Greening" and Sustainable Investment
- Respond to Maritime Cyber Risks
- Create a "Curiosity" Culture for Shipping
- Ensure Adequate Education and Training and Skills for Seafarers
- Promote the Provision of Efficient and Effective Maritime Services
- Create a Culture for Seafaring, Maritime and Blue Professions
- Promote Connectivity and a Safer, Greener and Accessible-To-All Coastline

23 out of 35 actions have been completed or are in the process of implementation



## Ensuring Certainty and Fiscal Stability

- ✓ Smooth & successful prolongation of Cyprus Tonnage Tax System for 10 years (Jan 2020 - Dec 2029)
- Abolition of registration & mortgage fees for ocean-going commercial Cyprus ships
- Streamlining & simplification of fees & dues relating to ocean-going commercial Cyprus ships









# Fostering a Proactive Safety and Security Culture

**Encourage a proactive culture of quality** on Cyprus flagged ships with the **aim to prevent future detentions** by providing **systematic information** to shipowners and ship managers on:

- ✓ Port State control concentrated inspection campaigns
- The outcomes of the analysis of deficiencies and non-conformities reported in the framework of:
  - ✓ Flag State and Port State Control
  - ✓ Annual Reports of the MoU on PSC

Ensure that the **statutory penalties** imposed because of deficiencies and/or non-conformities **are effective and proportionate** 

Memorandum of Cooperation between the Shipping Deputy Ministry and the Digital Security Authority regarding the Prevention of Cyber Risks in the shipping sector

Promote lifelong learning and continuous specialised training of the SDM Surveyors



# Contributing to a Greener Shipping sector

#### ...AT NATIONAL LEVEL

- Reward efforts to proactively reduce the greenhouse gas emissions through the introduction of **Green Tax Incentives**
- Encouraging and facilitating shipowners flying the Cyprus flag to take proactive action by conducting trials using alternative fuels such as Biofuels and Hydrogen





# Contributing to a Greener Shipping sector

#### ...AT EUROPEAN & GLOBAL LEVEL

- Actively involved to the EU and IMO deliberations in order to formulate a broad and diverse set of actions required to achieve emissions reduction targets. This involves a combination of measures, including the adoption of cleaner fuels, the deployment of relevant fuel infrastructure, electrification of ships, and the use of energy efficiency technologies
- Signatory to the "Declaration on Zero Emission Shipping by 2050" and to the "Green Shipping Challenge" Initiative launched at COP27
- Organisation of a virtual debate on European Commission's (EC) proposed Emissions Trading System (ETS) for shipping
- Organisation of a live SWOT analysis hybrid event on the potential of Low and Zero Emission fuels for Shipping





Creating the framework conditions for "One-Stop-Shipping-Shop" through...

- The adoption of a regulatory and administrative framework for the incorporation of Shipping Company
- The Digital transformation of all SDM Services with an ongoing project co-financed by EU's NextGeneration Resilience and Recovery Facility



#### **Shipping Limited Liability Company (S.L.L.C)**

- It aims to improve the competitiveness of the Cyprus flag in international shipping, as well as to simplify the procedures and operating regime of Cypriot shipping companies
- "The Shipping Limited Liability Company (S.L.L.C.) Law of 2022" (L.161/2022) was enacted by Cyprus Parliament (N.161/2022)
- S.L.L.C is addressed to Cypriot shipping companies that own Cyprus ships
- A Registry of S.L.L.C. is also created, which will be supervised by the Shipping Deputy Ministry

## Demonstrating Social Responsibility

Cyprus was one of the first countries worldwide that recognized seafarers as key workers

Cyprus shipping is globally acknowledged for its social responsibility and active contribution to the humanitarian crisis that the sector faced, through the support, development and implementation of practical and coordinated solutions

#### COVID-19:

#### at national level

- Crew changes and repatriation of over 65000 seafarers from Cyprus
- Implementation of a national vaccination plan to cover 40000 seafarers

#### at global level

Cyprus was the only state that proposed a global vaccination program for seafarers which was adopted in the form of an ILO Resolution in April 2021

#### Ukraine War.

- Extension of seafarers' employment agreements (SEA)
- Facilitating the opening of bank accounts for seafarers



### Responding to Crises

#### **Ukraine War**

- Provision of guidance, recommendations and clarifications on the implementing framework of the EU sanctions against Russia through Sanctions Information Notices
  - ✓ 15 Sanctions Information Notices have been issued so far with respect to the 9 European Union sanctions packages
- Active participation in the EU deliberations for the formulation of sanctions in order to ensure a level playing field and effective, strict and uniform application
- Upon Cyprus's suggestion EU Commission committed to adopt appropriate supportive measures, including by further developing existing instruments at the latest by 5 February 2023, to support the Union's shipping industry, and to encourage the re-flagging of ships to Member States' ship Registers



### Promoting Connectivity, Coastal Tourism, Safer & Greener Coastline

Reinstating a maritime passenger link between Cyprus and Greece, after a 21- year hiatus

Providing alternative connectivity to our citizens, strengthening the potential of maritime tourism between Cyprus and continental Europe

Seasonal service subsidized by the Cyprus Government for at least 3 years (2022-2024) with a possibility to prolong the subsidy until 2027, with 22 return sailings from Limassol to Piraeus scheduled over the summer period from May/June to Sep/Oct

Performance of the Service during the period June-Sep 2022

- 7412 passengers travelled with the CY-EL ferry link
- 205 pets
- 1946 cars/motorbikes transported



### Promoting Connectivity, Coastal Tourism, Safer & Greener Coastline

 Formulate a holistic and effective legislative and administrative framework for recreation crafts for public and private use

Targeted state aid scheme (de minimis) to prevent pollution, improve safety and to facilitate access to people with reduced mobility

"Let's DISCO" (Dive Into Shipping Career Opportunities):
A campaign to promote maritime studies and professions to secondary schools

- A Committee for the Development of Maritime Culture and the Promotion of Maritime Studies and Professions is established chaired by the Shipping Deputy Minister bringing together the shipping community of Cyprus to share our love and passion for shipping to the young generation
- A Mentoring Team of 16 young shipping professionals is established to provide guidance and share knowledge and experience with children, parents and teachers

### Focusing on the Future Generation

#### Cooperation with academies to improve and expand their offering

- Protocol of Cooperation between the Eratosthenes Center of Excellence of the Cyprus
   University of Technology and the Shipping Deputy Ministry
- Protocol of Cooperation between the Cyprus University of Technology and the Shipping
  Deputy Ministry, with the aim of expanding their scientific cooperation regarding matters
  of shipping and integrated maritime policy

#### Providing subsidies to cadets for on-board training and scholarships to marine academy students

- Subsidies in the amount of €1,361,473 to 883 cadets for on-board training
- Scholarships in the amount of € 165,000 to 55 marine academy students










# Developing Cyprus' Blue Economy


#### Maximizing the Growth Potential of our Seas in a Sustainable way




