

Question: Thank you, Florencia. My question is on Cyprus. On Friday, the Secretary-General appointed his personal envoy for the Cyprus issue as you recall. And shortly after the announcement, you may have seen that the “Türkiye Cypriot Presidency” released a statement maintaining that “President Ersin Tatar” accepted the appointment of the envoy on the basis of the agreement achieved regarding the mandate and the duration. And that basically, namely, the personal envoy will be appointed for a period of six months and with the sole mandate to explore whether common ground exists or not for the start of new formal negotiations between the two sides. And this was also followed by a release from the Turkish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, also underlining the importance of these two points. So, could you explain what the mandate and the duration of the personal envoy will be? And can you confirm these two points? Thank you.

Spokesperson: I honestly do not have very much other than what was in her appointment. You know, she will search for common ground on the way forward and advice on the Cyprus issue. This is all we have for now. I don't really have anything else to elaborate on... [Cross talk]

Question: You don't have anything on the duration of her mandate?

Spokesperson: I just know that she's going to take her position shortly. We will let her proceed. And if I have any further updates on this, I will let you know.
