## SPEECH BY HER EXCELLENCY MRS. LYDIA OFOSUA AMARTEY, HIGH COMMISSIONER OF THE REPUBLIC OF GHANA, ON THE OCCASION OF PRESENTATION OF HER CREDENTIALS TO HIS EXCELLENCY MR. NIKOS CHRISTODOULIDES, PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF CYPRUS, ON MONDAY, 16<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER, 2024

I have the honour to convey to you the fraternal greetings from His Excellency Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo, President of the Republic of Ghana. I also convey the best wishes of the people of Ghana to the people of the Republic of Cyprus.

Ghana and Cyprus have maintained cordial bilateral relations since the establishment of formal diplomatic ties between our two countries in 1989. Our two countries have also maintained a very pleasant relations at the multilateral level, through our shared commitment to international peace and security that hinges on international fair play and justice as enshrined in the principles of the United Nations, the Commonwealth and other International Organisations.
